

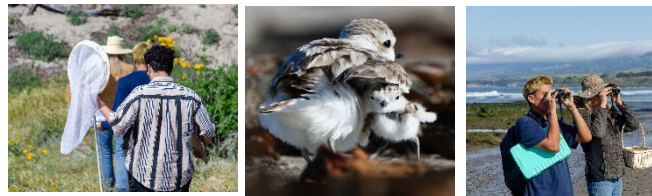
CORE *C*onservation and *R*estoration PROGRAM AT COAL OIL POINT RESERVE



The UCSB Coal Oil Point Reserve (COPR) is a nature reserve, 2 miles north of UCSB campus. Students can conduct a paid internship in nature while still attending classes at UCSB. Field experience helps students decide on a career and acquire skills. The [CORE program](#) seeks to provide field experience to UCSB students, particularly those who have not had this opportunity.

Over the course of the year, you will participate in one or more of the following successful programs and have the opportunity to attend field trips and symposiums with staff. We guarantee a stipend every quarter so students can rotate through the various program and gain a broader experience.

Commitment and Compensation:

- Commitment is a minimum of one quarter. Students are encouraged to rotate through different programs each quarter.

- Stipend amount: \$800 per quarter
